Toyota Had a Record High Profit : No1 in the world for mfg. industry

According to Toyota Motor, they generated more than ¥1,160,000,000,000 US\$10,000,000,000 for fiscal 2003/4.

This is the largest profit for manufacturing industry in the world. Asahi Shimbun, a nation-wide newspaper, is carrying a series of special analysis for the Japanese reader in general.

The analysis concludes that the continuous elimination of Muda is the most instrumental in making the historical record of profit.

Everybody knows that Muda (waste or no value) must be eliminated from all business processes : not only manufacturing but also non-production or over head.


But very few people or companies do not give up Muda elimination efforts. Toyota is an exceptional company.
